A Draught of a Tract of Land belonging to the Descendant of Stephen Harlan deceased lying in Bradford Township in the County of Chester which was laid out by Henry Hollingsworth unto one George Robinson for 250 acres in pursuance of a Warrant from the late Committee of Property bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> day of August 1707. But being since Resurveyed according to the known lines and bounds of the same and of the adjacent Tracts appear to contain 305 acres and the Allowance of Six acres p. Cent

Jeremiah Dean having obtained a Warr<sup>t</sup> for 50<sup>as</sup> more or less dated the day of Anno Domini 1740<sup>as</sup> in his own land Hannah Harlan widow & administratrix of Stephen Harlan deceased opposed by Survey post by the proprietor by James Steel setting forth their claim (as the same was stated by Jno Taylor's letter to him) also having desired the prop<sup>r</sup>s directions in the case he was pleased on the 4<sup>th</sup> of May 1740<sup>as</sup> that 250<sup>as</sup> thereof be laid out the heirs of Stephen Harlan if they derive<sup>r</sup> claim regularly from George Robinson who obtained a Warr<sup>t</sup> as afores<sup>d</sup> that y<sup>e</sup> Rent<sup>r</sup> 25<sup>as</sup> & allowance adjoining ther<sup>t</sup> Deans other land be laid out to Jerenn<sup>t</sup> Dean.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this Seventh day of February 1910
