At the Request of Joseph Robinson That we would grant him one Hundred and fifty acres of Land part of a vacancy in the Manner of Rockland lying between a Tract Survey'd to the London Company and Brandywine Creek where the sd Joseph has built a Mill for which he hath agreed to pay to the Proprietors Use forty pounds, Eighteen pounds thereof in hand and the Remainder in three Months with One Shilling Sterling p hundred and so proportionably Yearly for a Quittrent: These are to authorize thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the said Joseph Robinson the said Quantity of one hundred & fifty Acres part of y<sup>e</sup> said Vacancy leaving the Remainder thereof as near as may be of equal value to that which shall be so survey'd and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office, Which survey in case the said Joseph comply with the agreem<sup>t</sup> aforesaid shall be valid otherwise the same together with this Warr<sup>t</sup> shall be utterly void. Given under our hands and the Seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 14 day of the Third Month A.D. 1713.
