

At the Request of David Rees That I would grant him to take up two hundred Acres of Land in right of William Jenkins Old Purchaser of one thousand Acres who sold part thereof to ffrancis Howel who aliened his Right of 200 acres thereof to the sd David Rees. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey and Subdivide or cause to be Survey'd and Subdivided to him the sd David Rees the Said Number of two hundred Acres ~~as yet~~ in the Welch Tract, Where it has not been yet taken up nor subdivided and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philad'l'a the 4th day of y^e 12th
