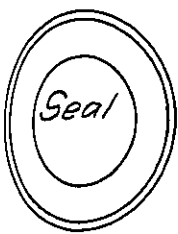

Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the 12<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1701.
