At the Request of ^{Everard} Edward Rearn now of New Strasburg that we would grant him to take up in or near that Township the quantity of two hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees of the Province within three Months after the date hereof Twenty pounds ^{Mony of Pensylvania} for the whole & the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Edward Rearn at the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of two hundred acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office, which Survey in case ye Said Edward fulfill the above agreement Shall be Valid otherwise the same shall be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and ye Seal of the Province at Philadelphia ye 1st day of ye 3rd A.D. 1719


