 26th of 9th 1701 for laying out to the s^d Exec^{rs} for y^e Use of the Said
 Estate One Thousand acres of Land in this Province, in pursu-
 ance of the Prop^{rs} Grant to them before his Departure, in lieu
 of the like quantity resigned or to be resigned by them on
 Indian River in Sussex, to be executed within the furthestmost

 vacant the full Complem^t of the s^d Tract near Gwynedd to complete
 y^e s^d Number of 934 Acres Also to execute our said former Warr^t
 as requested not interfering wth other Rights & mak^g Returns
 into the Gen^l Surv^r's office at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to re-
 main and a Copy thereof to be deliv^d to thee certified by y^e
 Secretary, Given under our hands & Seal of y^e Province at Philad^{ia}
