Whereas there was formerly by a Mistake Survey'd and laid out unto Benjamin Hurly in Right and as part of his original Purchase of five thousand Acres of Land in this Province from the Proprietor the quantity of one thousand acres in one Tract or parcel within the Bounds of that Tract in y^e County of Chester commonly Call'd the Welch Tract which Said thousand Acres So Located the s^d Benjamin could not Hold because of the aforesaid mistake and therefore has a right to take up the Same quantity elsewhere And whereas Dan^l ffalkner Attorney to the s^d Benjamin by vertue of the Power to him granted for that purpose has by his Deed bearing date the thirtieth day of August last granted among other things all the s^d Benjamin's Right to the s^d thousand Acres to John Henry Sproegel his heirs and assigns forever who requesting to take up the same These are to Authorize thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the s^d John Henry Sproegel according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of one thousand Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians And make Returns thereof into the Secretaries office Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 20th day of the Eleventh Moth 1708
