

By virtue of a warrant from the Commiss<sup>r</sup> of Property dated the 8<sup>th</sup> of the fourth month 1703 for laying out to David Lloyd six hundred and sixty six acres and two thirds of an acre of land being one third of two thousand acres Remaining untaken up of John Barber's original purchase of two thousand five hundred acres w<sup>ch</sup> 5d 3<sup>rd</sup> part the sd David had purchased of the said Barbers Relict & sole Executrix Elizabeth Webb
