



Alexander Buse's Land situate on Conestogoe Creek in the County of Chester (being y<sup>e</sup> one Moiety of 400 acres granted him by the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> <sup>dated ye 22<sup>d</sup> of August 1716</sup> Warrant) Beginning at a Hickery on y<sup>e</sup> North West Side of the s<sup>d</sup> Creek at a Corner of the s<sup>d</sup> Buse's other Land thence by the Same North West 370 pches to a Hickery <sup>by Conestogoe Manor</sup> thence South South West 31 pches to a White Oak thence by the Same South South East 126 pches to a Spanish Oak by the s<sup>d</sup> Creek thence Up the Same 460 pches to the place of Beginning Containing two Hundred acres and the Usual allowance of Six acres pCent Survey'd the 21<sup>st</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> 1718.
