In pursuance of a ^{General} Warrant from the Hon: Proprietaries. Dated the 31st day of December 1733 directed to the then Surveyor General there was survey'd to their Use on the 11th day of May 1740 a Certain Tract of Land situate near Mosselin in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a marked Hickery in a line of William Moyer's Land and from thence Extending by the same South Twenty Degrees East One hundred and Two perches to a marked White oak, and South seventy degrees West One hundred and twenty perches to a Post, thence by Adam Wiedners Land South Twenty Degrees East sixty eight perches to a post, and South seventy Degrees West One hundred and seventy seven perches to a Post, thence by Vacant Land and other Land Surveyed for the Use of the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries South East four hundred and forty six perches to a Post, thence by Vacant Land North seventy Degrees East four hundred perches to a post, North Twenty Degrees West Sixty perches to a Post, North seventy Degrees East Six hundred perches to a marked Black oak Sapling. & North Twenty Degrees West Two hundred and Ninety three perches to a stone, thence by George Boone's Land South seventy Degrees West Eighty six perches to a small marked White oak Sapling & North Twenty degrees West one hundred and fifty perches to a Post, thence by Peter Wentz's Land South seventy Degrees West Three hundred and forty eight perches to a Post, thence by Ulrick Sherer's Land South Twenty Degrees East fifteen perches, South seventy deg^s West One hundred and Ninety four perches to a Post, & North twenty degrees West Eighty five perches to a large White oak marked ~~with~~ thence by a line of marked Trees South seventy Degrees West Two hundred and sixty two perches to the place of Beginning Containing Two Thousand Nine hundred and Ninety Acres and the usual Allowance of six Acres & C^t for Roads &c^o Returned into the Secretarys Office the 9th Day of March Anno Dom. 1750.
