strictly charge thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to turn y<sup>e</sup> Lines of those Lands beginning  
at George Browns & follow on to John Woods. y<sup>t</sup> so y<sup>t</sup> Land may have a  
convenient outlet w<sup>th</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Lands adjacent. & make returns thereof into my sec. office Given at Philadelphia, y<sup>e</sup> 9<sup>th</sup>  
of y<sup>e</sup> 3<sup>d</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1684.
