As my Neighbour Quintain Armstrong is dissatisfied with one of the Lines of my Plantation, adjoining his Land & which was run thro' his improvement, and we being sincerely disposed to cultivate that Harmony & Friendship, which is absolutely necessary for Neighbours & Brethren to pursue, have made, & I desire the same may be altered on my Draft in your Office, in Order to Clear the Improvements which he then had made, which Alteration, you have in a Draft there of here inclosed, amounting to — And Allowance, and your Compliance in the Premises will very much oblige.
