These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the said John Decow in the Right aforesaid, and according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of One thousand Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is Seated by the Indians. And make Return thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands & the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 11th day of the 4th Month A. D. 1712.
