Whereas we have determined that the above written Proposals, signed by our Secretary & bearing even date herewith, for the sale of One hundred thousand acres of land in our said Province by way of Lottery, shall be forthwith put in Execution. And whereas Clement Plumsted, Thomas Lawrence, Charles Read, Thomas Graine Esq^{rs} & Patrick Baird Gent. are therein nominated, and hereby appointed as Managers to superintend the business preparatory to & drawing of the said lottery, and also to execute such other Matters as are therein mentioned.

We therefore do for our Selves & our Brother Richard Penn, by authority from him to us given, hereby promise & agree that every Article contained in the said Proposals, that is incumbent on us or our officers to perform, shall be strictly & duely complied with according to the true Intent & Meaning thereof. Given under our hands & the lesser seal of our said Province, at Philadelphia this 12th day of July 1735.
