Pursuant to a warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 1st day of September 1700. requiring me to survey or cause to be surveyed to his own proper use and behoof and his heirs after him five hundred acres in every township consisting of five thousand acres that shall be surveyed, and generally one tenth part of all the lands that shall be laid out in this Province or Territories.

I do hereby certify that accordingly I have ~~accordingly~~ caused to be surveyed unto the said Proprietary and Governour a certain tract of land situate in the township of Limerick in the county of Philadelphia beginning at a post by a street or road running through the said Township from thence by a line of marked trees dividing it from Joseph Pike's land south west five hundred perches to a post sett in the ground from thence north (ob.) by a line of marked trees one hundred and sixty perches to another post sett in the ground from thence north east by a line of marked trees five hundred perches to a post by the said street or road and by the same south east by a line of marked trees one hundred and sixty perches to the place of beginning. Certain and laid out for five hundred acres of land. Surveyed the 8th day of the 9th month 1700 and returned according to the abovesaid survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governour Secretary's Office the 17th day of the 10th month 1700. *Edw^d Pennington*
