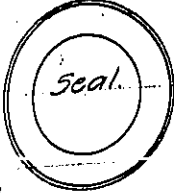

Whereas Sarah Black the Widow & Administr^{tr} of the County of York hath
 her
 requested that we would grant ~~her~~ our warrant for three hundred acres of
 land, joining the lands of Thomas Hossaack James Russell & others in Trust for her
 self & children of the said ~~late~~ Robert Black dece^d in — township, York County,
 being part of the Thirty Thousand acres of land which by our warrant of the
 eighteenth day of June, One Thousand seven hundred and Forty-one, we directed
 our then Surveyor-General to survey on the Branches of Marsh-Creek, on the West
 side of the River Sasquehanna, then in the County of Lancaster, now York, for our
 own proper Use, and the same to return under the Name and style of our Manor of
 Maske; and it now appearing to us, that the said three hundred acres of land
 was settled before the issuing our said warrant for the said Manor, we have
 notwithstanding condescended and agreed to grant the same to the said Sarah
 Black In trust as aforesaid on the then common Terms, the Interest and Quit-
 rent to commence from the First day of March, One Thousand seven Hun-
 dred and forty being the Time of settlement, and for which he agrees to
 pay to our Use, within the Term of six Months from the date hereof, at the
 rate of Fifteen Pounds Ten shillings current Money of this Province, for every
 Hundred acres; and also to pay the yearly Quitrent of One Halfpenny Sterling
 for every acre thereof, to us, our Heirs and assigns forever; These are there-
 fore to authorise and require you to survey, or cause to be surveyed unto the
 said Sarah Black In Trust as afo^d at the place aforesaid, according to the Method
 of Townships appointed, the said Quantity of three hundred acres, and make re-
 turn thereof into the Secretary's Office, in order for Confirmation; for which this
 shall be your sufficient warrant: Which warrant and survey, in case the said Sarah
 Black fulfil the above Agreements within six Months from the date hereof, shall
 be valid, otherwise void. Given under my Hands, and the seal of the Land-
 office, by virtue of certain Powers from the said Proprietaries, at Philadelp-
 hia, this eighteenth day of May Anno Domini One Thousand seven hundred
 and sixty five.
