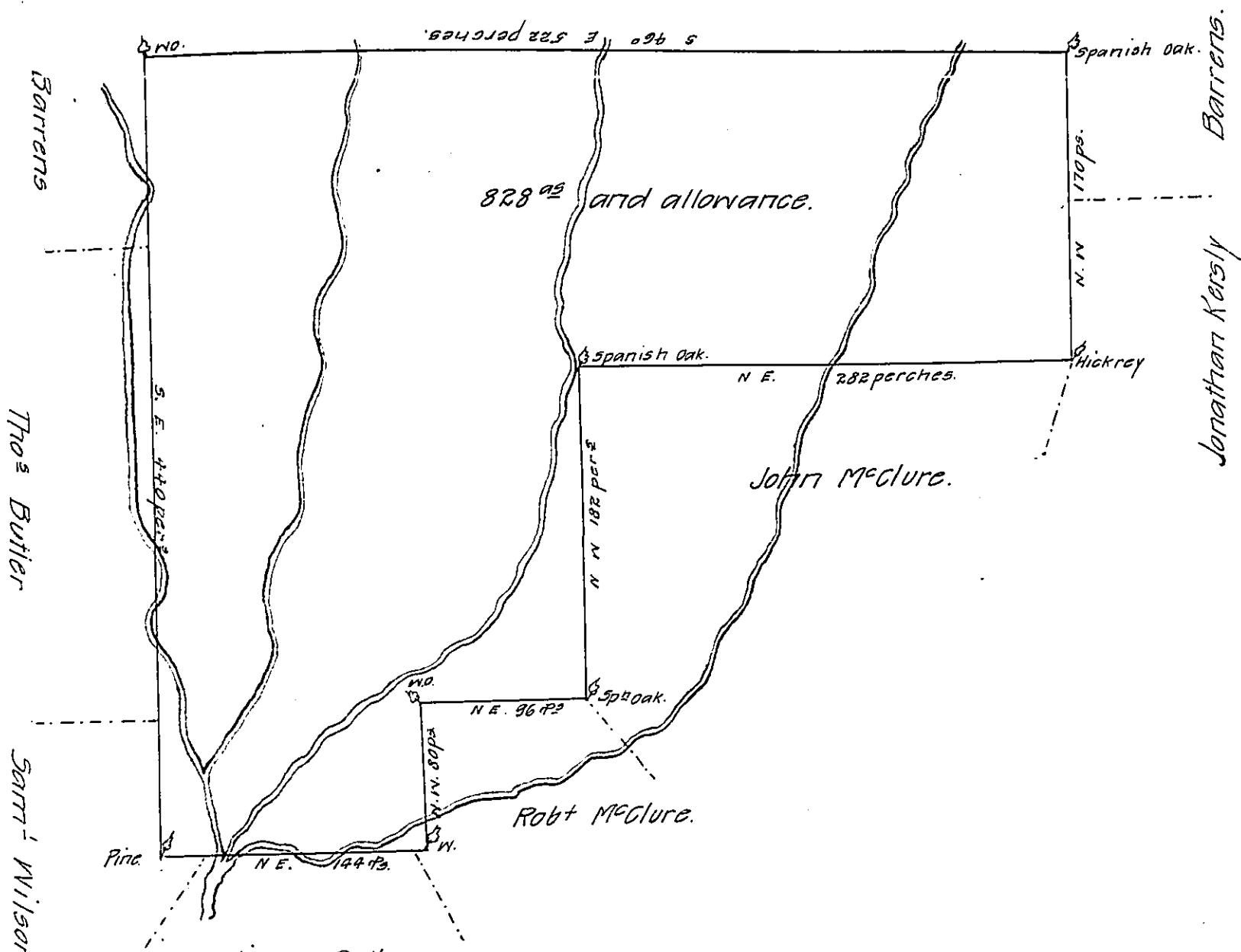


North Mountain

 A draught of a tract of land situate in West Pennsborough Township in the County of Cumberland containing eight hundred & Twenty eight acres & the usual allowance of six p Cent for roads Surveyed by Thomas Cookson & resurveyed for the Honourable the Proprietaries February the 25<sup>th</sup> 1761. in pursuance of a warrant Bearing date the fourteenth day of November 1741.

The above tract is in general but a poor Soil, im of opinion that 300<sup>ac</sup> next the mountain, ought to be thrown out, as only tending to retard the sale of the residue. Sundry persons adjoining have made fields & improvements within the tract posterior to Mr Cooksons survey of the fifteenth of September 1742 whome I have now discharged & orderd to desist their labour until the Proprietary pleasure is known.
