



Pursuant to a warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the 15th day of May 1729 There was survey'd to Clement Plumsted in right of Abel Strettle a certain tract or Cell of land Situate on the northern branches of Cookassing Creek in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a corner marked white oak standing at the North east corner of the Widow Rarribas wheat field thence north sixty degrees easterly by vacant land one hundred & ninety one Pches to a post thence north west by vacant land two hundred eighty one Pches to a post thence south west by vacant land two hundred and seventy four Pches to a post thence south east by vacant land two hundred and thirty two Pches to a post thence North east Crossing the 3^d wheat field ninety Pches to the place of Beginning Containing ffour hundred acres and the Allowance of six acres & Cent. Survey'd the 1st day of December 1730.
