

By the Commissioners of Property.

In pursuance of an agreement made by us about five years since with Divers persons of this City of Philad<sup>a</sup> for the better Improvement of several quantities of that Vast Swamp and Cripple which lies between ye Lands of Moyamensing Wickako & Delaware River, These are to authorise & require thee to survey unto Evan Owen of the said City Shop-keeper that part of the said Vast Swamp or Cripple which lies between the said River & the East side of a Road as new designed to be laid out from the said City to ye point in the said Swamp or Cripple upon Delaware opposite to ye Town of Gloucester in West Jersey and between the Creek called Hollanders Creek to ye Northward & that called Hay Creek to the Southward, reputed to contain fifty acres or some what less To Hold to the said Evan Owen his Heirs & Assignes forever upon his paying to the Trustees of this Province Ten Shillings Money of the same for every Acre thereof ~~with interest at eight per cent for four years commencing on the date~~ and after the rate of one shilling Sterling for one hundred acres as a yearly quitrent forever upon this further Condition nevertheless that the said Evan Owen his Heirs or assignes shall within ye space of seven years next ensuing after the date hereof well & sufficiently bank & Drain ye said piece of Ground intended to be hereby Granted so as to make the same fit for Pasture or mowing. Given under our Hands & ye lesser Seal of ye Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> ye 20<sup>th</sup> day of February Anno. Dir 1719
