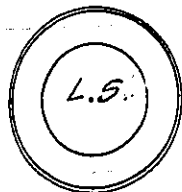


Pennsylvania, ss.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Andrew Hamilton of the City of Philadelphia that we would grant him a certain Piece of vacant Ground lying at the lower end of his Lot late Richard Woodworths in Chesnut Street and joyning on the Ends of Walnut Street Lots on the Side of the Dock for which he agrees to pay to the Use of the Trustees Twenty Shillings Money of Pennsylvania and the yearly Quitrent of an English Silver Shilling. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Andrew Hamilton in the place aforesaid the said piece of vacant ground containing in Length about Forty Feet and in Breadth about six and twenty Feet Bounding the same on the South with the said Ends of Walnut Street Lots on the West with a piece of Ground now Samuel Hudsons on the North with the said Lot late of Richard Woodworths and on the East with a Line drawn on the East Side of the last mentioned Lot continued to the Ends of the said Walnut Street Lots and make exact Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 5th day of the sixth month Anno Domi 1719.
