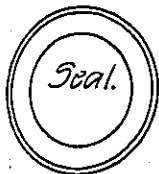


Pennsylvania ss.

At the Instance and request of Clement Plumsted of the City of Philadelphia Merchant that we would be pleased to grant him a resurvey on his part of the Bank and water Lot formerly laid out to the Society of Free Traders lying on the East Side of Delaware front Street and between Spruce & Pine Streets below the Dock in the said City and that we would allow him to Extend the bounds of the said Lot Eastward into the River Delaware the same distance from the said front Street as the Bank and water Lots at the South End of the said City are extended which said Lot belonging to the said Clement is hereafter to be held under the Quitrent of eight Shillings Sterling to be yearly paid for the same, These are to authorize and require thee to Resurvey or cause to be resurveyed unto the said Clement Plumsted according to the bounds and description aforesaid the said Lot of Ground and to Extend the limits thereof Eastward into the River Delaware so far as the Bank and water Lots lying below pine Street are Extended and make return of the same into our Secretary's Office in order for Confirmation and for which this shall be thy sufficient warrant Given under my hand and the Lesser Seal of the sd Province at Philadelp^a this 20th day of January Anno Domini 1735/6.
