By the Proprietaries.

Whereas our late Honoured Father William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> did by Deeds of Lease & Release bearing date the 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> days of October 1681, Grant & Convey in Fee unto a certain Thomas Scott then of London the quantity of five hundred Acres of Land to be located and laid out in the said Province, And the same was accordingly in virtue of a warrant from then Commissioners of Property located & laid out by the then Surveyor General of this Province at North Britain Township in the County of Bucks. But after the Location thereof aforesaid no care being taken to settle the same or preserve the Marks whereby to know or ascertain the particular Situation Metes and Bounds thereof, all the said located Tract hath been since taken up and by succeeding Surveyors laid out to other Persons and cannot now be found. And the absolute Right Title and Interest of in and to the said five hundred Acres being by force and virtue of certain mesne Grants & Conveyances in Law since made & executed now vested in William Allen of the City of Philadelphia Esq<sup>r</sup>. He hath requested us to grant him our Warrant to survey & lay out to him the said Quantity of five hundred acres in some other place where the same can be found unappropriated within the said Province: These are therefore to authorize and require you to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said William Allen according to the method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of five hundred acres within the said Province where the same shall be found not already surveyd or appropriated and make return thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for further Confirmation, for which this shall be your sufficient warrant. Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Land Office by virtue of certain Powers from the said Proprietaries at Philadelphia this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of September Anno Domini 1748.
