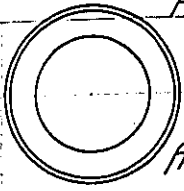


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Andrew Hamilton of the City of Philadelphia that we would grant him a certain piece of vacant Ground lying at the lower end of his lot late Rich<sup>d</sup> Woodworths in Chestnut Street & joining on ye Ends of Walnut street lots on ye side of the Dock for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees Twenty Shillings M<sup>o</sup>ny of Pennsylvania & ye yearly quitrent of an English Silver Shilling. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyd unto the said Andrew Hamilton in the Place aforesaid the said piece of vacant Ground containing in length about fforty foot & in breadth about six & twenty foot bounding the same on ye south with ye said Ends of Walnut Street lots on ye west with a piece of Ground now Samuel Hudsons on the North with ye said <sup>late</sup> lot of Richard Woodworths & on the east with a line drawn on ye east side of ye last mentioned lot continued to ye Ends of the sd Walnut Street lots and make exact returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 5<sup>th</sup> day of the sixth month Anno Di 1719.
