Whereas in or about the Year of our Lord 1702 There was Granted & Confirmed to John Henry Sprugel the Quantity of one Hundred Acres of Land near the Manor of Springfield on that part next Schuylkill Supposed then to be clear of other Claims But as it now appears upon a late resurvey the Greater part of the s^d one hundred Acres is within the lines of a Tract of Land joynting to the s^d Manor first laid out to Jonas Smith and now belonging to Isaac Norris, And Whereas the Right to the s^d one Hundred Acres being now Vested in Arent Hassert of the City of Philadelphia Merch^t who by means of the priority of Survey of the s^d Isaac Norris's Land cannot hold the s^d one hundred Acres as the same is now located he therefore requests that he may be permitted to Surrender & Release the s^d Location and to take up the like quantity within the s^d Manor of Springfield ad joynting to the afores^d Tract These are therefore to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the said Arent Hassert in the s^d Manor in a regular piece ad joynting to the said Land of Isaac Norris but leaving a Strip for a Road to Schuylkill the said quantity of one Hundred Acres of Land and make returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the fifth day of December Anno Dⁿⁱ 1727
