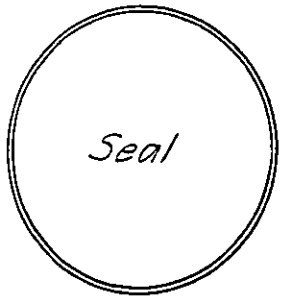

*At the Request of William Hudson of Philad<sup>ia</sup> That we would Grant him a City Lot in right of a Purchase of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province made of the Proprietor by William Cornthwaite of the County of Lancaster Yeoman by Deeds dated y<sup>e</sup> 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> dayes of May A D 1683 Purchased by y<sup>e</sup> said William & his Kinsman Jm<sup>e</sup> Cornwell with other five hundred Acres sold to Edward Atkinson of them the s<sup>d</sup> Cornthwait & Atkinson, in right of w<sup>th</sup> said Purchases, the Proprietor gave the s<sup>d</sup> last Purchasers an expectation (by their friend Jm<sup>e</sup> Blake in) that Lots in the City should be granted. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the said William Hudson a Lot in y<sup>e</sup> City of Philad<sup>ia</sup> of the common Dimensions where to be found Vacant And make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 8<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> Month A D 1713*
