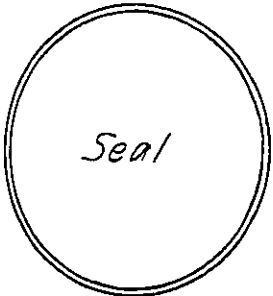

*These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be survey'd for head land to  
be divided among such as came servants into this Province at the first Settlement  
thereof a Tract of Land of about <sup>six</sup> ~~six~~ thousand Acres to be called Free Town in any  
County of this Province where it has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is  
concealed nor seated by <sup>ye</sup> Indians and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries  
Office Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia <sup>ye</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> of <sup>ye</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1701*
