At the Request of Humphrey Hill of the City of London (by his Attorney James Logan) that We would Grant him to take up the Quantity of Six Hundred Acres of Land in this Province purchased of the late Proprietor by Henry Tompason of Westminster Vintner by Deeds of Lease & Release dated the 3<sup>d</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> dayes of April Anno 1695 whose Son & Heir John Tompason by Indenturs of Lease & Release dated the 22<sup>d</sup> & 23<sup>d</sup> dayes of January Anno 1723 Granted & Released the whole unto the said Humphrey Hill These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Humphred Hill in Right of the purchase made of the Proprietor as aforesaid According to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of Six Hundred Acres of Land that has not been Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the Fourth Month Anno Dni 1725
