 Crossing the Road North fifty Nite degrees east one hundred and four Perches
 to a Post Thence South East Ninety two perches to Post Then South West two
 hundred twenty five perches to a Corner marked Hickery tree ~~in~~ in Germantown
 Line The four Lines Last mentioned running by the Remain^{ing} Land of the
 Mannor Then by the said Germaint line North West One hundred and Eighty
 Pches to the Place of Beginning Containng One hundred Ninety five acres
