At the request of Philip Howel That we would Grant him to take up ffifty acres of headland in right of Richard Carrill who came into this Province abo^t y^e first settling thereof Servant to Cap^t W^m Smith And ffifty acres in right of Daniel Thomas who came in Servant to Rees Rooderagh And ffifty acres in right of Elenor Thomas wife to y^e s^d Daniel formerly — who came in Servant to David Lawrence And ffifty acres in right of John Lloyd who came in Servant to John Bevatt-being in all two hundred acres These are to require thee to Survey and Lay out to y^e s^d Philip Howel y^e s^d Quantity of two hundred acres of Land appropriated to Servants where not already Surveyd nor taken up nor Concealed nor Seated by y^e Indians, according to y^e Method of Townships appointed and make Returns into y^e Gen^l Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy to be Deliv^d to thee Certified by y^e Secretary Given under our hands and y^e Seal of y^e Province at Philad^{ia} y^e 9th day of 9th 1702
