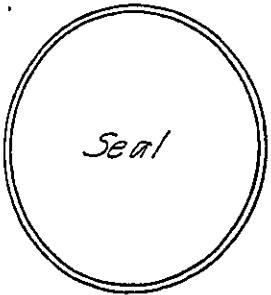


Pennsylvania

Whereas Francis Smith Purchaser of five hundred Acres entered upon a certain Lot in the Second Street from Delaware in the City Philadelphia in right of his said Purchase adjoining on the Southside of William Grosdale's Lot and being thus entered sold the same to Philip Howel, w<sup>ch</sup> sale the Proprietary especially favouring the said Francis was pleased to confirm: These therefore are to require thee forthwith to Survey and lay out to the said Philip Howel the afores<sup>d</sup> Lot proportionable to the purchase aforesaid and make Returns thereof into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be deliv<sup>d</sup> thee certified by the Secretary who is also to take a Duplicate of thy Return into his Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 16<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1701
