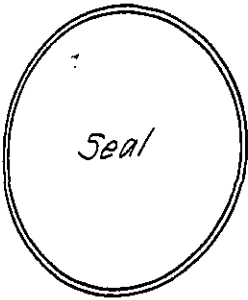


Pennsylvania

Whereas John Hughes hath for some years past been Seated on part of the Narrow slip or Neck of the Manor of Springfield leading to the River Schuylkill which Seating the Proprietary (as tis affirmed to us) did before his Departure promise to confirm to the s<sup>d</sup> J<sup>n</sup><sup>e</sup> Hughes on a reasonable Consideration, who has thereupon requested us to Grant & Confirm to him sufficient Settlement in y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> place: These therefore are to Authorize thee to Survey and lay out to the s<sup>d</sup> John Hughes fifty Acres of Land in y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> place of y<sup>e</sup> Manor where he is now Seated extending the same to half y<sup>e</sup> breadth of the s<sup>d</sup> Neck and no more provided that the s<sup>d</sup> Land be not a chosen Spott and exceed not the adjacent Lands in Goodness, of which make Returns into the Gen<sup>l</sup> Surveyors Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain, and a Copy thereof to be deliv<sup>d</sup> to thee certified by the Secretary which Survey in case the s<sup>d</sup> J<sup>n</sup><sup>e</sup> Hughes his heirs or Assigns doe pay unto y<sup>e</sup> Proprietary or his proper Officer twenty pounds in consideration of the s<sup>d</sup> fifty Acres with ~~yearly~~ <sup>as a Rent</sup> lawful Copy<sup>d</sup> Interest yearly for y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> sum<sup>m</sup> fill it shall be p<sup>d</sup> as also Rent for the time he hath possessed y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Land, shall be good & Valid otherwise shall be void and of no effect as if the same had never been made nor this Warr<sup>t</sup> ever Granted - Given under our hands and y<sup>e</sup> Seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 10 day of 9<sup>th</sup> 1702
