At the Request of Philip Howel That we would grant him to take up fifty Acres of ~~Land~~ head Land in right of John Thomas who came into ~~serv~~ this Province about y^e first Settling thereof Serv^t to Evan Frytharch and fifty Acres in right of Margery Thomas Wife to the s^d John who came in Serv^t to Jenkin Lewis And fifty Acres in right of Anthony Morgan who came in Serv^t to William Smith And fifty Acres in right of the s^d Anthony his Wife Elizabeth Morgan formerly— Who came in Serv^t to y^e s^d W^m Smith And fifty Acres in right of John Jones of Philadelphia who came in Servant to William Hard ~~and~~ Being in the whole two hundred and fifty Acres These are to require thee to Survey to the s^d Philip Howel the s^d quantity of two hundred and fifty Acres of Land appropriated to Servants, where not already Survey'd nor taken up nor

concealed nor Seated by the Indians, according to the Method of Townships appointed And make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be deliv^d to thee certified by the Secretary Given under

our hands and the Seal of y^e Province at Philad^{ia} the ninth day of November 1702
