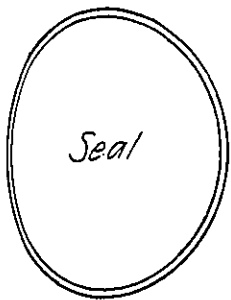


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Robert Sinclair of the County of Chester that We would Grant him to take up four Hundred Acres of Land in the said County for which he agrees to pay to the Prop<sup>r</sup> use fforty pounds for the whole and the Usual Yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every Hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd unto the said Robert Sinclair According to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of four Hundred Acres of Land in the said County that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office. which Survey in case the said Robert Sinclair fulfill the above agreem<sup>t</sup> within three Months after Location shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our Hands and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia the two & Twentieth day of the tenth Month Anno D<sup>ni</sup> 1714
