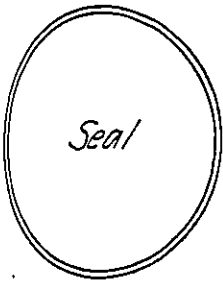

By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Thomas Edward of the County of Philadelphia that We would Grant him to take up in this Province two Hundred and Seventy Six Acres of Land the remainder of one Thousand Acres Originally purchased of the Propriet<sup>r</sup> by Thomas Bond of Woodacre in the County of York in Great Britain the right of which s<sup>d</sup> remainder being now Vested in the said Tho: Edward. These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Thomas Edward in the s<sup>d</sup> Province according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two Hundred & Seventy Six Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 13<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> month A D 1716
