Property and the Seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province dated y<sup>e</sup> 29<sup>th</sup> day of September  
1702 for Resurveying the Township Gw<sup>un</sup>tedd or Northwales.

Resurveyd unto Cadwallader ap Evan a Tract of land in the Township of Gw<sup>un</sup>tedd and  
County of Philadelphia Beginning at a black oak at the Corner of Robert ap Evans  
land from thence by a line of Marked trees dividing it from Thom<sup>s</sup> Evans land North  
forty four deg<sup>r</sup>: and a half easterly three hundred and seventeen perches to a  
Corner Marked hickery tree from thence south east by a line of marked trees two  
hundred eighty three perches to a Corner marked white oak by Owen ap Evans  
land South forty three degrees and a half westerly three hundred fifty seven  
perches to a stake sett at the ~~other~~ Corner of Robert ap Evans land then by the  
said land North thirty eight degrees and a half westerly ~~two~~ two hundred ninety  
five perches to the place of the beginning Containing six hundred and thirtie  
acres Resurveyd by David Powel and Returned the 21<sup>st</sup> X<sup>br</sup> 1702 in the General  
Surveyors office
