Humphry's land from thence by the same land with the land of Edward ffulk and  
Evans ap Hughs Land South forty four degrees west eight hundred seventy nine  
perches to a stake by Edward ffulk's land from thence by a line of Marked trees  
north west ninety two perches to a stake from thence by Robert ap Evans's land and  
Cadwallader ap Evans's land North forty three degrees easterly eight hundred seventy  
nine perches to the place of Beginning Containing five hundred thirty eight acres  
Resurveyed by David Powel and returned into the General Surveyors office the 21<sup>st</sup>  
day of the 10.<sup>mo</sup> 1702
