At the Request of Coll-John Evans by his father in Law John Moor that We would Grant him to take up his Proportion of Liberty Land appurtenant to William Morallants Purchase of five Hundred Acres of Land in this Province which is now sold to Coll-Evans These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the said Coll-Evans within the Liberties of the City of Philadelphia the quantity of Eight Acres of Land being the proportion of y^e said Purchase the same being clear of all other Surveys and Lawfull Claims and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia

the 16th day of y^e 10th Month Anno Domini 1715.
