would grant him an addition to his Twelve Acres, & Twenty Acres on acc<sup>t</sup> of y<sup>e</sup>  
Geo. Shore's Land <sup>th</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Liberties of y<sup>e</sup> City. These are to will & require thee  
forthw<sup>th</sup> to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto him Twenty eight Acres, Twenty  
whereof on acc<sup>t</sup> of Geo: Shore, & eight to himself, ~~and~~ <sup>in y<sup>e</sup> form I shall order</sup> adjoining to y<sup>e</sup> Twelve Acres,  
already layd out for him on Skulkill, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's  
Office; Given at Philadelphia, y<sup>e</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> 10<sup>br</sup> 1683.
