At the Request of Robert Edwards That We would grant him to take up three hundred Acres of Land in the Manor of Gilberts for which he has agreed to pay within two Years after the Survey thereof twenty pounds for every hundred with lawful Interest from the date of Survey to the time of Paym<sup>t</sup>. These are to require thee to survey and lay out to the s<sup>d</sup> Rob<sup>t</sup> Edwards the s<sup>d</sup> quantity of 300 Acres of Land in the s<sup>d</sup> Manor fronting the River Skuylkill beginning above the line run out in the s<sup>d</sup> Manor for a Towne extending by the s<sup>d</sup> Line Northeast to Perqueominick Creek and from thence by another parallel Line to the afores<sup>d</sup> from y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Creek to Skuylkill and make Returns thereof into the general Surveyors Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be deliv<sup>d</sup> to thee certified by the Secretary. Which Survey being by thee made & returned as afores<sup>d</sup> shall ~~be valid otherwise~~ in case the s<sup>d</sup> Rob<sup>t</sup> fulfill the Agreem<sup>t</sup> afores<sup>d</sup> be valid, otherwise shall be void and of no other effect than as if the same had never been made nor this Warr<sup>t</sup> ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 28<sup>th</sup> of the 2<sup>d</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1702.
