These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to make Return into the Secretary's Office the Survey heretofore made on a Tract of Land Containing Seven hundred Acres within Our Manner of Conestogoe lying on the North West Side of the Land late belonging to John Cartilage deceased which said Tract of Seven Hundred Acres is intended to be Granted and Confirmed unto James Logan of Stenton in the County of Philad<sup>e</sup> Esg<sup>r</sup> in Lieu of the Like Quantity of Acres of Land to be by him Released to Us lying on the French Creek in the County of Chester for the doing whereof this shall be thy Sufficient Warrant Given under my Hand and the Lesser Seal of Our Province at Philadelp<sup>o</sup> this 24<sup>th</sup> day of the 4<sup>th</sup> Mo (June) Anno Dom 1734.
