

By virtue of A Warrant from Richard Hill James Logan & Robert Asshton Commiss^{rs} of Property to me Directed Dated the 10th day of y^e 4th M^o A^o Dⁱ: 1725 I have Caused to be Surveyed & laid out unto Humphry Hill of the City of London the Quantity of Six hundred Acres of Land purchased of the late Prop^r by Henry Thompson of Westminster Vintner by Deeds of Le^s & Rel^s dated y^e 3^d & 4th days of April A^o Dⁱ: 1721 whose Son & heir J^r: Thompson by like Deeds of Lease ^{& Release} dated y^e 23^d & 24th days of Jan^y: A^o Dⁱ: 1723 Granted y^e whole to the s^d Humphry Hill, The s^d Land Situate in the County of Philad^a on a Branch of Perkeyony Creek Beginning at White Oak at a Corner of J^r: Penns Manor Thence N. forty degrees^E by a line of Marked trees Three hundred & Twelve perches to a Post Thence North fifty degrees west by a line of Marked Trees Two hundred & Eighty perches to a Post Thence South forty degrees West by a line of Marked trees Three hundred & Sixty four perches to a White Oak Thence South fifty degrees East by a line of Marked Trees Two hundred & Eighty perches ^{to a Post} in the line of the s^d Manor Thence by the Same North forty degrees East fifty Two perches to the place of Beginning Surveyed the 5th of Augst 1725.
