Whereas James Logan of Stenton in the County of Philadelphia Esq^r being legally vested with the Right of two thousand Acres of Land the original Grant made by our late Father William Penn Esq^r unto William and Abraham Lloyd of the City of Bristol in Great Britain hath already obtained [in Pursuance of former Warrants] some Parts thereof to be surveyed to himself and his Assigns and now requests that we would be pleased to grant him our farther Warrant for Surveying the Residue of the Quantity of Land afores^d

These are therefore to Authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said James Logan according to the Method of Townships appointed the Residue of the afores^d Quantity of two thousand Acres of Land and make Return thereof into our Secretary's Office in Order for Confirmation and for so Doing this shall be thy sufficient Warrant Given under my Hand and the lesser Seal at Philadelphia the twenty fourth Day of May Anno Domini 1737.
