Having borrowed the Draught of Germantown Lots made by Matthias Zimmerman I make so far bold with it and the 2 or 3 sheets explaining it as to send it to thee for thy view (if thou hast never seen it before) being fit in my opinion to have some notice taken of it in thy Office but must request to have it returned as soon as possible, the Loan of it to me being accounted as a great favour I must also request thee, if the weather & thy business will by any means permit, that thou wouldst step up hither as early as thou canst next week to execute that Warr^t that I have requested from the Prop^t for running the Division Line between this Township and Germ^t for there is some very wide Mistake as thou mayst easily perceive by the draught now sent, on some side or other. That draught I know by some sure tokens was not made earlier than the year 1711 nor later than 1713. Warmers Land is N^o 11 E 12 and the Boundaries on y^e N W & S E are by that 430 & 432 Poles I must also desire thee to come time enough to shew my People as also if practicable to ^{have them} new mark or blaze as they follow thee all the out Lines of this Plantation & of my Land on y^e other side Germ^t Road and in thy compliance thou wilt particularly oblige
