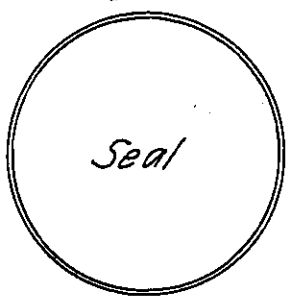


Pennsylvania ss.

At the Request of James LeTort that We would Grant him to take up on or near the River Sasquahanna where he now dwells the quantity of five Hundred Acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to y<sup>e</sup> Use of the Proprietary Trustees fifty Pounds Money of Pennsylvania for the whole and the Yearly quitrent of One Shilling Sterling for each Hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said James LeTort at the place aforesaid including his Improvement already made & extending the Survey at least one Mile back from the said River. The said Quantity of five Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said James fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same shall be Void as if it had never been made. or this Warrant ever granted Given under our Hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 25<sup>th</sup> day of y<sup>e</sup> first Month Anno Dni 1719
