At the Request of William Harmer that We would Grant him a Resurvey on fifty Acres of Land formerly belonging to Thomas Fairman & adjoining to a Tract of Land Laid out to Robt Longshore in Order to Ascertaine the bounds of the said two Tracts of Land and alsoe that We would Grant him to Take up three Hundred Acres of Land in the Mannor of Springfield for which he agrees to pay to the Prop<sup>rs</sup> Two Hundred Pounds for the whole & the Usual Yearly Quittrent of one Shilling Sterl for every Hundred Acres These are to Authorize and Require thee to Resurvey or cause to be Resurveyd unto the said William Harmer the said fifty Acres of Land and alsoe to Survey or cause to be Surveyd unto him in the said Mannor the said Quantity of Three Hundred Acres of Land and make a Returne thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 22<sup>d</sup> Day of the 10<sup>th</sup> Month Anno D<sup>r</sup> 1714
