At the request of Edward Rees that we would grant him a resurvey on two hundred and five acres and a quarter <sup>of Land</sup> situate in Meirion Township in the County of Philadelphia now in y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Edw<sup>ds</sup> possession 80 Acres & 1/4 thereof laid out in right of John Thomas and Edw<sup>d</sup> Jones & y<sup>e</sup> residue in right of Charles Loyd & Marg<sup>t</sup> Davies Original Purchasers. These are to require thee to resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd the s<sup>d</sup> tract of 205 1/4 acres according to the first bounds and true lines of survey and make returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 22<sup>d</sup> day of the 10<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1701.

Upon the surv<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>ls</sup> decease thou art required
