By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of James Robins in Great Britain by his Brother Sam^l Robins Philad^a that we would grant him to

take up in this Province the quantity of five hundred acres of land the original purchase of Ann Oliff late of the City of Oxon dec'd made of the Prop^r by Identures of Lease ^{& Release} dated ye 8th & 9th dayes of September Anno 1681 and since by good conveyances the same is now vested in the said James Robins these therefore are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said James Robins in the said Province according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred acres of Land (first deducting the proportion of Liberty Land) that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for a further Confirmation. Given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 4th day of the first month Anno Dni 1717. Richard Hill
