At the Request of James Robins of the City of London by his Brother Samuel Robins of Philadelphia that we would grant him to take up the Lott of Ground within the City of Philad<sup>a</sup> and the Liberty Land within the Liberties thereof appurtenant to ffive hundred acres of Land purchased of the Prop<sup>r</sup> by Ann Olliff late of the City of Oxon Dec'd by Indentures of Lease & Release dated the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> dayes of September Anno 1681 The right whereof being now vested in the said James Robins in the said City on Schuylkil side thereof the said Lott of Ground proportionable to the said purchase and within the Liberties thereof the Liberty Land appurtenant thereunto and make Returns of the whole into the Secretary's Office in order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> day of y<sup>e</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> Mo. A.D. 1717
