At y<sup>e</sup> Request of John Rush<sup>late</sup> Purchaser y<sup>t</sup> I would grant him  
to take up a Lott in y<sup>e</sup> Town of Philadelphia: These are to will & require thee  
forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him a Lott in y<sup>e</sup> fourth  
Street joining to y<sup>e</sup> widow Sherters' Lott he fencing it in & build-  
ing upon y<sup>e</sup> same w<sup>th</sup> in one year from y<sup>e</sup> date of survey & make  
returns thereof into my Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia  
y<sup>e</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1684.
