

William Penn absolute Proprietary and Governour-in-Chief of the Province of Pennsylvania and Counties annexed

At the Request of Andrew Bankson, Benjamin Bankson John Stillely Andrew Wheeler and William Wells That I would grant to each of them to take up fifty acres of Cripple and to John ffox ten acres of the same Cripple lying adjacent to Wiccacoe and Miamensen Lands. These are to Require thee forthwith to survey to each of the^{sd} Andrew Bankson, Benjamin Bankson, John Stillely, Andrew Wheeler and William Wells the said Quantity of fifty acres and to the said John ffox the said number of ten acres of the said Cripple adjacent to or lying most commodious for their respective Plantations and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office

Given under my hand and seal of the Province at Philadelphia (obi.) twenty sixth day of Oct^{ber} 1701.

In Pursuance of the above Warrant there was surveyd & laid out the nineteenth day of December in the year 1719 unto the said Benjamin Bankson a Tract or Parcel of the said Cripple Beginning at a corner of James Lowms his land on the² Southside of Hollanders Creek Thence south by the said Lowms Line Eighty-six perches Then east by a line of marked trees ninety-six perches Then north by John Stilly's Land ninety-six perches to the said Hollanders Creek Then down the several Courses of the same about One hundred perches to the place of Beginning containing fifty acres.
